## **Step #2: Define Priorities**

#### Mission

The mission of Garrett County Public Schools, in partnership with our community, is to inspire and foster student growth by providing rigorous instruction and learning opportunities, sustaining a culture of excellence, and preparing our students for life in an ever-changing world.

#### Goals

- All students will be challenged with a rigorous instructional environment preparing them to become lifelong learners and responsible citizens.
- Partnerships with all members of our community will be fostered and strengthened by engaging them in the education of our children.
- All students and staff will learn in a safe, secure, and caring environment where everyone is valued and respected.
- Every department and school will be a good steward of system resources and will manage them in a cost-effective manner.
- All employees will be highly qualified and effective in their jobs contributing to a self-renewing organization.



## **Step #2: Define Priorities – Mandatory**

#### **Sustaining Safe In-Person Learning**

- Health & Safety Initiatives
  - School Nursing Coverage
  - PPE Supplies Masks, hand sanitizer, wipes, etc.
  - Cleaning staffing & supplies
  - Air quality
- Instructional Recovery
  - Blueprint for Maryland's Future Revisions (HB 1372) requires
    summer programming & additional tutoring in FY2022 & FY2023
  - Federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act- requires alignment with CDC guidelines for a safe return to school as well as significant use of funding to measure and address the academic impact of lost instructional time on all students through:
    - Summer Programming
    - Extended Learning Opportunities (before or after school)
    - Evidenced Based Interventions
    - Academic Interventions/Tutoring



# **Step #2: Define Priorities – Mandatory**

#### **Blueprint for Maryland's Future Legislation**

- FY 2023
  - Salary Minimum National Board Certified Teacher salary increase of \$10,000 plus an additional \$7,000 for an NBC teacher at a low performing school.
  - **Budget –** "Minimum School Funding" means 75% or 100% of the per pupil amount must be distributed by the school enrollment for the applicable program.
- FY 2024
  - Salary LEAs must demonstrate to the Accountability & Implementation Board that between July 1, 2019 & June 30, 2024, teachers received a 10% salary increase above the negotiated schedule.
  - Programmatic -
    - GCPS could possibly have a school become "Concentration of Poverty".
    - Post College & Career Ready Pathways must be offered at no cost to students.
- FY 2025
  - Salary Career ladders are required for teachers hired on or after July 1, 2024.
- FY 2027
  - Salary Minimum Teacher Salary for all teachers shall be \$60,000.

- High academic standards and continued focus on learning loss due to the pandemic
- Meet the social, emotional, and behavioral needs of all students
- Attract and maintain a strong workforce which includes teachers, support staff, bus drivers, administrators, custodians, & food service providers



High academic standards and continued focus on learning loss due to the pandemic

- High quality Tier I core Math and ELA instruction
- Strategic interventions and recovery opportunities
  - Prioritize students with the largest learning gaps
  - Evidence based interventions during the school day & after school
  - Continue comprehensive summer programs



### Meet the Social, Emotional, and Behavioral Needs of All Students

- Effects of the Pandemic Are Evident
  - Continued focus on mental health needs
  - Behavior support
  - Professional development & support



## Attract and Maintain a Strong Workforce

- Comprehensive teacher induction and mentoring program
  - Year-long mentoring program for teachers in their first three years
  - Targeted professional development
  - Continued partnership with Frostburg State University
    - Maryland Accelerates Program
    - Teacher interns
- Implement Blueprint requirements
- Strong support system for teachers pursuing National Board Certification
- Evaluate hiring practices for equity and diversity



#### **Address Facility Utilization**

- Implementing instructional priorities & mandatory requirements of the Blueprint are becoming increasingly difficult, if not impossible, with the current footprint
- GCPS students and staff deserve quality facilities that are safe and conducive to optimizing learning.
  - Eliminate existing open space formats
  - Install air conditioning at all facilities
  - Complete the safety vestibule initiative
- State's participation in capital projects can be as much as 90% of the total cost if facilities are utilized effectively. Current challenges of gaining participation include:
  - Declining student enrollment negatively impacts utilization.
  - State approval is on a project by project basis.
  - The 90% participation rate could change each legislative session

#### **Goal: Obtain Board of Education feedback**



- Purpose:
  - Provides the basis for evaluating potential investments of funds
  - Strategically plan for FY 2023 and beyond
  - Superintendent & her team will have a clear understanding of Board expectations
