School Responsibilities:

Crellin Elementary School staff will:

Provide high quality instruction in a supportive learning environment to enable students to meet Maryland's academic standards as follows:

- Use the Common Core State Standards for instructional planning
- Use instructional strategies that motivate and assist students with their understanding of academic concepts
- Have high expectations for learning and achievement for all students
- Assure that every student has access to quality learning experiences appropriate to their development
- Assign appropriate homework that extends and reinforces lessons
- Believe that each student can learn at his/her pace and strive to meet their needs

Hold parent-teacher conferences (twice annually) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.

- Conferences are held after the second grading terms and by appointments throughout the school year
- IEP meetings are conducted as required

Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress.

- Mid-term progress reports are sent home with students every 4-5 weeks
- Teachers may send home student work daily or weekly

Provide parents with reasonable access to staff.

- Parents may telephone or schedule appointments with their child's teachers
- Each staff member will communicate to families through the student planner
- Parents will receive newsletters with school information, activities, and events

Provide parent opportunities to volunteer in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- Parents may volunteer in the classroom by scheduling a time with their child's teacher
- Parents are encouraged to take an active role on school committees

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning by:

- Making sure my child attends school every day and is on time
- Making sure that homework is completed
- Checking and signing the student planner for assignments and communication
- Attending school conferences and reviewing schoolwork
- Attending Back to School Night and participating in the Parent Teacher Organization

- Making sure my child is well rested
- Reading and responding as necessary to all communication from the school
